What Annual Trips does WILD take?

Each year WILD takes 2-3 summer trips and has the potential for other trips as well.

- Middle School Rainbow Trail typically in mid June
 - Students in grades completed 6th-completed 8th spend a week in Colorado at Rainbow Trail Lutheran Camp where they experience high ropes, white water rafting, mountain climbing, and more. And, in the midst of all the fun, they grow closer to each other and God.
 - Registration may vary from year to year, but typically costs around \$600 per student. That number includes registration, rafting, and an estimate for meals on the way out and back and any souvenirs purchased at camp. Transportation is fundraised.

• High School Mission Trip – typically in late June

- Students in grades completed 9th-completed 12th can attend this weeklong trip. Over the course of seven days, they serve alongside amazing organizations and learn about the unique challenges found in more-diverse communities.
- Registration may vary from year to year, but typically costs around \$625 per student. That
 number includes registration, travel lodging, and an estimate for meals on the way out and
 back and any souvenirs purchased on the trip. Transportation and excursions are fundraised.

• High School Rainbow Trail – typically in late July

- Students in grades completed 9th-completed 11th spend a week in Colorado at Rainbow Trail Lutheran Camp where they experience high ropes, white water rafting, mountain climbing, and more. And, in the midst of all the fun, they grow closer to each other and God.
- Registration may vary from year to year, but typically costs around \$625 per student. That number includes registration, rafting, and an estimate for meals on the way out and back and any souvenirs purchased at camp. Transportation is fundraised.

• ELCA Youth Gathering – typically mid-July every 3 years

- Students in completed 9th-completed 12th grade spend a week in the city chosen for the gathering. In 2024, it is in New Orleans, LA. Students will attend mass gatherings with 30,000+ other students from around the country and will hear speakers, bands, participate in service events, etc.
- Registration may vary from year to year, but typically costs around \$375, but does increase as the deadlines pass. That number includes registration, however, extra money will be needed for lodging, meals and any souvenirs purchased by the student. Transportation is fundraised.

What is Confirmation?

As a church, we want to give our students a deep understanding of the Bible and their faith. Confirmation is one year long — starting at the end of summer and finishing at the end of spring.

- Confirmation is open to any student in middle school (odd years) or high school (even years). Students will be expected to attend weekly, memorize the Lord's Prayer and Apostle's Creed (not as scary as it sounds), and write a one-page faith statement (also not as scary as it sounds).
- Confirmation will meet weekly (mostly) on Sundays, starting in mid-September from 11:15am-1pm. Confirmation Sunday ends the culmination of the year-long study and is typically in mid-May.
- Confirmation Retreat varies from year to year
 - Confirmation students will attend 1-2 overnight, weekend retreats over the course of the school-year-long study.
 - They will grow in community with each other and in their faith journey.

• Registration may vary from year to year, but typically costs around \$50-100 per student. That number includes registration, food, and any materials needed. Transportation is fundraised.

What do Sunday mornings look like?

Each week ages Preschool-12th grade begin in worship for songs and Communion. After Communion they are dismissed to their age-appropriate classrooms for relevant lesson, discussions, and teaching.

- WILD begins their time with a game or activity that involves all 6th-12th grades. Then, the main speaker for the day will introduce the lesson topic.
- After that, 6th-8th grades and 9th-12th grades will divide up into small groups for discussion.
- For 6th-12th grades, students are released to find their parents at the conclusion of worship.

Does WILD have weekday Bible studies?

Yes! The day/time, content, and age level varies from season to season.

What does the SALT (Student and Adult Leadership Team) do?

Mission Statement: The mission of SALT is to build up students to become leaders for Christ by equipping them with the tools necessary to change lives with His love. SALT is the Student and Adult Leadership Team of Kaw Prairie. This team will collaborate to plan for and support the WILD Student Ministry program. Students will learn and practice event planning, presentation skills, and more as they partner together with staff and an adult mentor of their choice.

- Anyone (Grades 6th-12th) are invited to be part of SALT. There is an online registration form, however.
- The Student Leadership Team will be tasked with choosing and planning WILD Student Ministry social and serve events as well as having a part in growing the community of WILD.
- Student Leadership Team Retreat varies from year to year
 - The Student Leadership Team may have 1-2 overnight or daytime weekend retreats over the course of the school-year-long term.
 - They will grow in community and focus on growing their leadership skills and sharing their faith story.
 - Registration may vary from year to year, but typically costs around \$50-100 per student. That number includes registration, food, and any materials needed. Transportation is fundraised.

What is Collective?

Collective exists to merge opportunities for students at various church congregations and beyond! Our tagline, "Youth Groups Collaborating" expresses that the more students who can get together and celebrate friendship, fellowship, and faith, the better!!

- Collective will have several events on our calendar throughout the school year for 6th-12th grade students.
- The leaders from the various youth group involved in Collective are the ones who lead Collective.
